GNOMES: THE WACE PLANNING INSTITUTE MODEL

The Institute introduces a simple, yet powerful planning model — GNOMES — as a guide for teams to use with facilitators as they design their own plans for advancing their institution's experiential education programs and portfolio.

The GNOME will give participants a framework to facilitate smooth implementation of their plan when they return to campus.

On the first day of the Institute, teams present their current campus programs, as well as their goals for the week. Throughout the week, team conversations about planning will be facilitated by Institute Faculty Members. On the fifth day of the Institute, teams present their future plans, followed by discussion and feedback from all Institute participants and faculty.
